Flower Circles: Made to Measure Wall Art for your Home.

Inspired by the success of her latest commission - a large-scale wall and window installation depicting hundreds of iridescent flowers - architectural glass artist Binita Walia www.thespaceinbetween.co.uk is launching a bespoke interior design service especially for the home.

The original design was created for a new hospital in Durham depicting 'healing' flowers. As the constantly changing light hits the individual flower shapes it creates a delicate shimmering effect across the walls of the main atrium. But the piece works equally well in a domestic setting. The cut out flower shapes are applied around a unifying circle and adhere directly to walls, ceilings and woodwork. They can be designed to suit any room in the house in a variety of sizes, finishes and colour combinations.

Each commission will be designed in close consultation with the client. *"They will have the opportunity for input by choosing their favourite flowers, plants or other organic shapes to be incorporated into the final design,"* says Binita. *"The aim is to create a beautiful, decorative artwork for the home that is also a talking point and has a personal resonance for the owner."*
